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Tales from a church basement: Exploring beliefs about writing and a writer's voice among volunteer literacy tutors and their multilingual students

This paper presents the findings from an ethnographic case study of volunteer writing tutors who assist linguistically and culturally diverse adolescents develop their writing in an afterschool literacy program.

The paper foregrounds tutor and tutee beliefs about what is good writing and writing with voice, a preferred feature of good writing in Ontario for K-12 students (i.e., Success Criteria), and the degree to which tutors helped students develop voice in their writing.

The paper will also present the unexpected challenges the graduate researcher faced during and after data collection and the ways he resolved them.
